### Prayer for Ash Wednesday

Eternal Father:

We pause, this day, to remember Thy great love revealed in Jesus of Nazareth. ### The Imposition of the Ashes

Lent is a time for evangelism and for true conversion—a time for growing through repentance, fellowship, prayer, fasting, and concentration upon our covenant. We are to be representatives of God's kingdom in this world. On Ash Wednesday, a day of penitence marking the beginning of Lent, the forty-day preparation for the paschal celebrations of Easter, we recall our mortality and wait upon the LORD for renewal by His Spirit. Yea, His Spirit tests us, that our faith may be authentic and that we may truly die and rise with the Christ unto new life in Him.

Thus, in the spirit of penitence, remembering our Master who set his face to Jerusalem to be arrested and executed and to suffer unto death for God's sake, we receive the ashes of Lent in His name.
